JUST A THOUGHT:



Dear Fellow Traveller,

The Passage of time

During November we continue to remember “The Holy Souls” Most of those who peopled our personal lives we remember with gratitude. Others we find impossible to forget. As each of us prepares for our own death we have different attitudes. I remember my father’s attitude as he was given the diagnosis of terminal cancer by the doctor - his two questions he asked the doctor - how long do I have and will I go “yellow” ? he subsequently made a will (looking after those left behind as best he could) and he cut a tree saying to my mother “you will have enough firewood to keep you warm for three years” !

Steve Jobs, the founder of Apple Computers on the other hand had a very different “take” on it : . In 2005, his days already numbered, he delivered the 2005 Graduation speech at Stanford University. He invited the students to explore the taboo topic of death with him.. He told the graduates: “No one wants to die. Even people who want to go to heaven don’t want to die to get there. And yet death is the destination we all share. No one has ever escaped it. And that is as it should be, because Death is very likely the single best invention of Life. It is Life’s great agent of change. It clears out the old to make way for the new. Right now the new is you, but someday not too long from now, you will gradually become the old and be cleared away. Sorry to be so dramatic, but it is quite true”. It was a great speech. But there was something missing. In his speech he dehumanises death by ignoring the devastation it leaves in its wake. Those who talk too quickly about ‘moving on’ empty death of its meaning and make it sound like a mere interruption of our strident march to embrace our destiny. The death of a loved one is traumatic and we must not deny it! Over 60 parishioners died in Salthill last year . Everyone of them had a family mourning them with a gap in their hearts. Seamus Heaney’s line “The space we stood in had been emptied. As we remember our dead we pray for the grace of “Acceptance” -- “Accept the things we cannot change, Change the things we can and the Wisdom to know the difference.

Stay well and may Life be good to you.
