Dear Fellow Traveller,

Today's Gospel spells out a clear message of REPENT.

Perhaps we need to broaden the meaning to the word REPENT from the hard idea of sinfulness and failure. A nicer meaning as 'TURN or Go a different way'. We all make mistakes which makes us human. However it doesn't have to be that way. Jesus challenges us to examine our past and face up to our weaknesses. The future need not be a mirror of our past.
